

The Tenth South Gippsland One Act Play Festival, held in Foster in August, proved to be a very popular an enjoyable event. Adjudicator, Gaye Gay, awarded the coveted Most Outstanding Production Award to Hartwell Players for an entertaining play called *Fur Better or Worse* about a cat.

The play also earned the Most Outstanding Director award for Laura Bradley and the trophy for the Most Outstanding Actor Award which went to James Shaw as Felix, the cat.

The runner-up award in the best play category went to Frankston Theatre Group for *A Dog's Life* which featured four adults playing dogs.

The Most Outstanding Female Actor accolade was won by Genya Mik as Daphne in Pop Culture Theatre's drama, Waiting for Doggett.
