

"We will be screening an exciting film on the first Friday of each month" FAMDA President Tania Pell said. "We have decided to start this film society to bring quality and sometimes challenging films to South Gippsland audiences" she added.

FAMDA has a strong reputation for providing Foster audiences with entertaining and often quirky plays and the Prom Coast Film Society aims to keep up this tradition using a new medium.

FIRST SCREENING

The first film to be screened by the new Prom Coast Film Society will be the 2010 Australian movie, *Animal Kingdom*. *Animal Kingdom* portrays the lives of an Australian crime

The screening will commence at 8:00pm on Friday, 4 March, at the Fish Creek Hall. There will be no charge for the first film, but subscriptions will be available on the night. Rules governing Victorian Film Societies allow only subscriptions, so, rather than charging for individual films, the Prom Coast Film Society will be offering annual (\$75) and three month (\$28) membership subscriptions. Subscription sales will be available at

each screening.

To make the screenings a very social night Windy Ridge Winery will have wine by the glass to purchase and supper will be available after the film has been shown.

The week from 10th to 14th January I attended the Victorian Drama League Summer School for teenagers. It was so much fun I didn't want it to end.

During the week we had classes from 9.30am until 5.30 pm. We covered 11 different areas of theatre. These were; drama, dance, movement, musical theatre, improvisation, clowning, costuming, tech theatre, script work, audition skills and character development. We also had a day of touring theatres in Melbourne and watched Hartwell Players' full dress rehearsal of the pantomime, Robin Hood in 3D.

My favourite area was clowning. We created our costumes from the pile they provided, made up our faces and had to develop our personalities. We worked together to create names for our character and worked on improvising as the characters. The fun part was that everyone could be silly together without feeling self conscious.

The experience has enlarged my knowledge of theatre and given me an opportunity to develop and add to my skills. I also met a whole lot of kids who like doing the same things as I do.

At the very end of the week we gave a performance for the parents where we showed them a sample of the week's activities.
