The Shoe–Horn Sonata deals with the brutality of World War II by viewing the stories of two fictional characters, Bridie and Sheila.

In 1945 they were freed from a Japanese POW camp deep in the jungles of Sumatra where thousands of women and children had lived and died virtually forgotten by their own governments.

Fifty years later the filming of a television documentary forces them to relive the past, contact the present and question the future. Woven into their half century separation are a shoe-horn and the threads of loyalty and love which form their bond. The characters are fictional yet every incident they describe is true and occurred between 1942 and 1995.

The playwright, John Misto, was concerned that the pain and suffering that many women endured at the hands of their Japanese captors after the fall of Singapore had been forgotten. He said "I do not have the power to

build a memorial so I wrote a play instead."

In 1995, when Misto won the \$20,000 Australia Remembers National Play



Competition for *The Shoe-Horn Sonata*, he donated his prize money to the Australian Nurses' National Memorial Fund. Misto's passion for the story shines through in creating a poignant play complete with gentle humour and an uplifting ending.

David Baggallay is directing this compelling drama for FAMDA with Marg Rudge and Jean Moore in the key roles.



The Tall Man is the story of Palm Island, a tropical paradise in Australia's Far North. It is the story of Cameron Doomadgee, who in 2004 was arrested for swearing at Senior Sergeant Chris Hurley - the 'tall man' of the title. 45 minutes later, Doomadgee was dead.

This extraordinary documentary takes the audience into the coronial inquest; into the riot that rocketed the story to the nation's front pages; the charging of Hurley for murder and into the once notorious Queensland police force. We see the impact on Doomadgee's family and the Indigenous community of Palm Island - a place where people live lives like no others, have a relationship with the land like no others, and a history, culture and a catastrophic present like no others. This is Australia, but an Australia few of us know.

Based on the award-winning book by Chloe Hooper, The Tall Man is a gripping and provocative film that exposes the inescapable complexities of Australia's racial politics, and a haunting moral puzzle that no viewer will forget.
