

FAMDA successfully hosted its 12th Festival of One-Act Plays on 11 and 12 August.

Nuworks Theatre dominated the winners' list with 'Treachery', a production with Shakespearean overtones. The play was written specially for Nuworks by David Dunn and allowed five young actors to shine in a cast which also included five remarkably talented adults.



For those who saw all the plays in the Festival there seemed little doubt that 'Treachery' was in fact the most outstanding production.

'Treachery' earned the 2012 Bruce Crowl Award for the Most Outstanding Production with David Dunn winning both the Most Outstanding Director trophy and the Playwright's Prize for Best New Play 2012.

Three of the young people involved in Nuworks' 'Treachery' were awarded with Andrew Lopes winning the Most Outstanding Support Actor category, Meg Dunn being judged the Most Outstanding Youth Performer and Gordon Bedlow earning the Victorian Drama League Encouragement Award.

The Most Outstanding Female Actor accolade went to Katharine Innes for her performance in Noel Coward's 'Still Life' staged by Beaumaris Theatre.

**Norwegian Wood** is a Japanese drama directed by Tran Anh Hung, based on Haruki Murakami's novel of the same name. It was released in Japan on 11 December 2010.

The story concerns Toru Watanabe, a quiet young man in 1960s Tokyo whose personal life is in tumult, having lost his best friend Kizuki after he inexplicably commits suicide. Seeking an escape, Toru enters a university in Tokyo where, by chance, he meets Kizuki's ex-girlfriend Naoko, and they grow close. However after Naoko's 20th

birthday she withdraws from the world to live in a remote forest setting near Kyoto. Toru continues with his studies, and during the spring semester meets an attractive girl and fellow student Midori, who is everything that Naoko isn't - outgoing, vivacious,

The story then follows Toru as he is torn between the two women in his life, and choosing between his past and his future.
