

2015 Seachange Festival dates are Friday 17 - Sunday 19 & Friday 24 - Sunday 26 April. FAMDA's musical, *Waratah*, is part of the Seachange Festival. It will also be staged in the week following the Festival on Thursday 30 April and the first weekend in May.

The show features 21 songs from a golden age of Australian rock and pop including songs made famous by The Loved Ones, The Twilights, The Groop, Normie Rowe, Lynne Randell, The Masters Apprentices and many more. Baby Boomers in the audience will be filled with nostalgia and an itch to dance. Younger audiences will be able to see a fading version of Australia and hear some great songs for the first time.

The author, Chris Dickins, has written several 'jukebox' musicals, which have been highly successful. He is an award winning writer and director specialising in large cast plays with roles for people of various ages.

The *Waratah* cast features many award winning performers including Nicole Cooper, Terry Lay, Bruce Grainger, Joanne Street and Noel Stringer.

Sarah Maclean is performing two roles as well as serving as production manager and has three of her children involved in the show. Leuca Maclean and Harley Macdonald, who were so memorable in FAMDA's *Foreigners from Home*, return along with newcomers Evy Nye as Caralyn, a girl who turns many young heads and Sean Webb as the odious shop owner, Ken Vile.
