

When FAMDA was founded, way back in 1953, it was known as **Foster FAMDA** with the initials in the acronym standing for Film, Art, Music & Drama Association. In the early 1990s it was decided that rebranding the organisation as Foster Amateur Music & Drama Association would more fittingly reflect its activities. It was only recently that we discovered that this change had never been legally ratified. When the opportunity arose to rename the association the committee felt that changing the name to **Foster Arts Music & Drama Association** would be more appropriate.



This resolution was approved at FAMDA's 2015 Annual General meeting and we have just received notification that the powers that be in Melbourne have given their stamp of approval to our new title.



PCS COMMUNITY SINGERS

On June 29 six representatives of the Prom Coast Singers gathered at Prom Country House to witness Tania Bird hand a cheque for \$500 to Prom Country Aged Care CEO, Rhett McClennan. The money was from the proceeds of the sold-out Foster performance of 'They Went With Songs', presented as part of the Prom Coast Seachange Festival and also performed in Wonthaggi and Leongatha in conjunction with the commemoration of the centenary of the Gallipoli Landing.

NOW IS THE TIME TO JOIN (OR REJOIN) THE PROM COAST SINGERS

Seventeen members of the Prom Coast Singers were involved in the massed choral event, *They Went With Songs*. They warmly invite others to join them for their weekly singing rehearsals which will be recommencing on Tuesday 14th July.

The choir's Musical Director, **Claudene-Marie Adams**, has been busily researching new repertoire for the choir, hunting up music which is "positive, energetic/ ethereal – beautiful and happy" in a variety of styles, drawing from different eras of music - classical, jazz and modern composers.

The program may well include music by Bach and Handel alongside works composed by Cole Porter, Simon & Garfunkel and Andrew Lloyd Webber with some gospel and jazz in the mix as well. Choir members could find themselves singing, for example, contemporary Australian works such as *The Seal Lullaby* by Eric Whitacre, show tunes like *Razzle Dazzle* from the stage musical, *Chicago*, and Gilbert & Sullivan - what a contrast!



Claudene-Marie promises to encourage development of vocal range, personal engagement, movement, music reading skills and interpretation of music. Rehearsals will be sociable and fun, challenging vocally and spiritually uplifting as the Prom Coast Singers work towards a concert performance later in the year.

Singers also have the joyous prospect of a weekend of singing as renowned conductor, Richard Gill, has accepted PCS's invitation to run choral workshops in Foster in September 1916 similar to the 2011 'Sing South Gippsland!' project.

PCS Tuesday evening rehearsals resume on July 14 at the Anglican Church Hall in Foster.

Arrival is 7.15, warm up from 7.30. Participation is \$6 per rehearsal.
