

SingSouthGippsland2 The first weekend in spring singers flocked to Foster for a choral festival, SingSouthGippsland2!

> The attraction was the celebrated Richard Gill AO, one of Australia's most pre-eminent and admired

conductors specialising in opera, musical theatre and vocal and choral training, internationally respected as a music educator and known to many more as a frequent guest on television's 'Spicks and Specks'.

Richard was inspirational in keeping over 100 singers from five Gippsland choirs, plus several independent singers, energised, enthused, educated and thoroughly entertained during the course of two singing workshops.

Hosted by the Prom Coast Singers, the festival provided the

opportunity for choristers from the ranks of the Bass Coast Chorale, the West Gippsland Chorale, the Yallourn Madrigal Singers and two Foster choirs, the Prom Coast Singers and Bec's Bonny Boners, to sing from their remarkably diverse repertoires in two concert performances in which they were joined by some independent singers when Richard Gill conducted as the massed choir presented a song sample from the workshop.

Prom Coast Singers' chairman, Andrew Jamieson, was on hand after the final concert as Celia Rosser presented a delighted Richard Gill with a framed print of one of her iconic Banksia paintings as a memento of the event.

The Vagina Monologues is an episodic play written by Eve Ensler who first performed it herself Off-Broadway in 1996. She has since written many more monologues so that a company staging the monologues today has many from which to choose to form a program.

Initially written to celebrate the vagina and femininity, the purpose of the piece gradually changed to a movement to stop violence against women. Each of the monologues deals with an aspect of the feminine experience, touching on matters such as sex, love, rape, female genital mutilation, masturbation, birth and orgasm. A recurring theme throughout is the vagina as a tool of female empowerment and the ultimate embodiment of individuality.

The piece has been described as "spellbinding, funny and almost unbearably moving . . . written with a bluntness that is nevertheless intensely lyrical, it is both a work of art and an incisive piece of cultural history, a poem and a polemic, a performance and balm and a benediction".

FAMDA plans to stage *The Vagina Monologues* next year leading into the Prom Coast Seachange Festival with seven performances at the Foster Arts Centre between 10 and 24 March.

Brad Beach is directing *The Vagina Monologues* for FAMDA and is looking for a cast of six women from a variety of ages. It is anticipated that each actor will perform two or three monologues during the course of the evening.
